

## NBCE Announces Student Scholarship Competition

**Greeley, CO.** – The NBCE announced an annual scholarship competition on March 17, 2016, at the Association of Chiropractic Colleges Research Agenda Conference. The scholarship is offered to chiropractic students who are enrolled in a U.S., CCE-accredited, chiropractic degree program at the time of submission. Additionally the author must be in good academic standing and have passed all of the NBCE Part I exams.

In announcing the program, NBCE President Dr. Donna Craft commented that, “The NBCE is a long-time sponsor of research in chiropractic. Through this new scholarship program, we are expanding on our organizational goal to ensure professional excellence by supporting academic excellence among students of chiropractic colleges.”

The annual program will provide three awards of \$2000 each for outstanding scholarly papers. The deadline for submission is August 1, 2016. The essay must focus on or relate to chiropractic humanities topics including: history, philosophy, practice perspectives, jurisprudence/law, ethics, theory, sociology, politics, and all aspects of social sciences that address historical or philosophical topics.
