

NBCE SEEKS NEW DISTRICT V DIRECTOR

Greeley, Colo.—National Board of Chiropractic Examiners President Dr. Paul Morin announced today that the Board of Directors is seeking interested individuals to fill the District V Director's seat on the board of directors. This vacancy on the Board of Directors is due to Dr. Norman Ouzts' recent selection to be the NBCE's new Executive Vice President (EVP). Dr. Ouzts had served as District V Director since 2007.

Dr. Ouzts said of his selection as the new EVP, "Serving as the District V Director has been an amazing honor and one of the most rewarding opportunities in my professional career. I am excited to move into my new role as EVP and look forward to working with my replacement to advance the NBCE."

District V includes the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia. The NBCE board will appoint Dr. Ouzts' replacement, who will serve as District V Director until the May 6, 2017, annual meeting in Orlando, Florida. At that time, the position of District V Director will open for election to fill the remaining one-year term of Dr. Ouzts, with the recently appointed director eligible to seek the seat.

The qualifications of the individual eligible to fill the vacancy includes the following:

- the individual must be a resident of the district.
- the individual must be a licensed doctor of chiropractic.
- the individual must currently serve or have been a member of his or her state licensing board within a three-year period prior to election/appointment.
