

MORIN ELECTED AS NBCE PRESIDENT

GREELEY, Colo.—Paul N. Morin, D.C., was elected President of the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners (NBCE) in Phoenix, Ariz., on April 29, 2016. Dr. Morin's service to the Executive Committee of the NBCE Board of Directors includes a one-year term as Secretary in 2010-2011, a three-year term as Treasurer from 2011-2014, and a two-year term as Vice President from 2014-2016.

Dr. Morin is also serving his third term as NBCE's District III Director, elected to his first term in 2009 and re-elected in 2012 and 2015. District III includes the states of Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island and Vermont and the District of Columbia.

Dr. Morin received his B.S. from Bates College in 1981 and attended Palmer College of Chiropractic, graduating Magna Cum Laude in 1984. He has been in chiropractic practice in Maine since 1984. In 1996, Dr. Morin was appointed by Maine's governor to serve as a member of Maine's Chiropractic Licensing Board and is currently chair of the organization. He received the Maine Chiropractic Association's Legislative Award in 1999, the President's Award in 2000, and he was named Chiropractor of the Year in 2009.

In addition to his service in chiropractic, Dr. Morin is a Registered Parliamentarian with the National Association of Parliamentarians.

Headquartered in Greeley, Colo., the NBCE is the international testing organization for the chiropractic profession, with the mission of ensuring professional competency through excellence in testing. Established in 1963, the NBCE develops, administers and scores legally defensible, standardized written and practical examinations for candidates seeking chiropractic licensure throughout the United States and in several foreign countries.
